Lake Tazawa, Japan’s deepest lake, captivates visitors with its clear waters and the legend of Princess Tatsuko.

**Day 4 :- Toyama (Fushiki), Japan**

Toyama, situated along the Sea of Japan, seamlessly blends natural wonders with cultural sites. The Tateyama Kurobe Alpine Route offers a scenic journey through the Northern Alps, featuring the impressive Kurobe Dam and snow corridors. Kurobe Gorge presents a picturesque ravine accessible by a charming trolley train, especially stunning during autumn foliage. The village of Gokayama, a UNESCO World Heritage site, is known for its traditional gassho-zukuri farmhouses.

Tsuruga, a coastal city in Fukui Prefecture, boasts a rich history as a strategic transportation center. The city is home to ancient temples and well-preserved historical sites that offer a glimpse into times past. Its coastline, forests, and wetlands add to its natural allure.

**Day 6 :- Sakaiminato, Japan**

Sakaiminato, located on the coast of the Sea of Japan, is famed for its connection to Japanese folklore. The Mizuki Shigeru Road, dedicated to the renowned manga artist, features 177 bronze statues of yōkai (supernatural creatures) and various attractions like the Kappa Spring and Yokai Shrine. The road also houses the Mizuki Shigeru Museum, showcasing his works and personal collection.

**Day 7 :- Busan, South Korea**

Busan, South Korea’s second-largest city, offers a mix of urban and natural attractions. Haeundae Beach is a popular seaside destination known for its vibrant atmosphere. Gamcheon Culture Village, with its colorful hillside houses and artistic installations, provides a unique cultural experience. Jagalchi Fish Market, Korea’s largest seafood market, offers a glimpse into local culinary culture. Haedong Yonggungsa Temple, a picturesque Buddhist temple situated on coastal cliffs, adds to the city’s charm.

Nagasaki, a city with a rich history of international exchange, offers several notable attractions. The Nagasaki Atomic Bomb Museum documents the events and aftermath of the atomic bombing in 1945. Dejima, former Dutch trading post, played a crucial role during Japan’s period of isolation.
